Regional Build – Market Opportunities

UK Government social infrastructure spending focused on prisons, schools, hospitals and defence



Justice

- 20,000 new prison places required
- £4bn commitment over 4 years
- C.£250m per annum of estate management



Education

- 500 DfE school replacement projects over 10 years
- > 200 further free school projects approved for DfE capital funding



Health

- Up to £22.2bn indicative capital funding to 2030-31 under New Hospitals Programme
- £685 accelerated delivery fund to eliminate RAAC



Defence

- £5.1bn Defence Estate Optimisation Portfolio
- £400m to be spent in improving military homes
- £650m future capital investment across UK Visiting Forces Estate in UK

 Continued opportunities to work with blue chip clients on mixed-use commercial developments

Alliance 4 New Prisons Programme

Appointed to Ministry of Justice's £1bn New Prisons Programme



- Four contractor alliance members to deliver over 6,000 places at four new prisons
- Blueprint for Ministry of Justice ("MoJ") portfolio
- First prison HMP Millsike
- Aligned to Construction Playbook
- Prioritises Modern Methods of Construction ("MMC") to maximise efficiency incorporating:
 - Standardised components
 - Platform design for manufacture and assembly ("DfMA")
 - Digitalisation of construction

Resettlement and training prison creating 1,500 prison places with a value of £400m




HMP Millsike – Future of Construction


- 54-acre site in Full Sutton, East Yorkshire
- Value: £400m + enabling works
- UK's first electric prison
 - Run solely on electricity, using solar panels, heat pumps and efficient lighting systems
- Category C prison
 - Resettlement and training prison
 - 1,500 prison places
- Building on success of HMP Five Wells, the MoJ's pathfinder project
- Completion in 2025



Initial Groundworks

Major groundworks including site clearance and high level of ground water management

Modernising Construction

New construction approach optimising time, quality, efficiency and sustainability



- Digital platform Ynomia used to generate 3D digital twin to visualise every component
- Tracking accurate build process throughout delivery from design and manufacture through to installation
- Lifecyle performance use and performance of every component is monitored accurately during construction and throughout asset life cycle



- Standardised Approach design and construction focusing on efficiency and repeatability
- Modern Methods of Construction precast concrete to reduce materials and waste. Delivering majority of the build off-site
 - Components 16,500 components manufactured offsite by UK supply chain partners. Premanufactured value c.85%







Key focus areas: Our People Our Places Our Planet





Environment and Social Sustainability at HMP Millsike

Driving down carbon emissions and delivering social value to the local community



- 100% waste diverted from landfill
- Over 60% of plant and machinery hybrid/electric



- All-electric prison
- c.80% less energy used than a typical Victorian prison e.g.
 Wormwood Scrubs



- 68 apprentices and trainees*
- c.560 upskilled workers*
- "Making Ground" initiative supporting prison leavers into jobs



- c.50% site based local labour*
- c.95% offsite local labour*
- Over 40% of supply coming from within 50 miles of site
- Over 1,000 local volunteering hours
